2 MR. PAROLA: My name is Fred  
3 Parola. I'm the Executive Director  
4 of the Town of Hempstead Local  
5 Development Corporation before whom  
6 we have an application from the  
7 Academy Charter School for certain  
8 tax benefits, bond benefits. We  
9 will hear all that want to be heard.

10 Just for the record, may I  
11 introduce to my left Eddy Longo, our  
12 CFO; our counsel, John Ryan; Michael  
13 Lodato, Corporate Administrator for  
14 the Local Development Corporation; a  
15 member of our Board of Trustees,  
16 Bill Hendrick.

17 Notice is hereby given that a  
18 public hearing pursuant to Section  
19 147(f) of the Internal Revenue Code  
20 of 1986, as amended (the "Code")  
21 will be held by the Town of  
22 Hempstead Local Development  
23 Corporation (the "Issuer"), on the  
24 19th day of June, 2017, at 10:00  
25 a.m., local time, at 350 Front

1  
2 Street, 2nd Floor, Hempstead, New  
3 York 11550, in connection with the  
4 following matters:

5 The Academy Charter School, a  
6 duly organized and validly existing  
7 not-for-profit New York education  
8 corporation and exempt from Federal  
9 income taxation pursuant to Section  
10 501(a) of the Code as an  
11 organization that is described in  
12 Section 501(c)(3) of the Code,  
13 having an office at 117 North  
14 Franklin Street, Hempstead, New York  
15 1150 (the "School"), has applied to  
16 the Issuer, to issue its Tax-Exempt  
17 Revenue Bonds, Series 2017A (The  
18 Academy Charter School Project),  
19 under Section 145 of the Code, in an  
20 amount presently estimated to be  
21 approximately \$35,000,000, but not  
22 to exceed \$40,000,000 (the "Series  
23 2017A Bonds"), its Tax-Exempt  
24 Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series  
25 2017B (The Academy Charter School

1  
2 Project.), under Section 145 of the  
3 Code, in an amount presently  
4 estimated to be \$30,000,000, but not  
5 to (exceed \$36,000,000 (the Series  
6 2017B Bonds"), and its Taxable  
7 Revenue Bonds, Series 2017C (The  
8 Academy Charter School Project), in  
9 an amount presently estimated to be  
10 approximately \$2,000,000, but not to  
11 exceed \$5,000,000 (the "Series 2017C  
12 Bonds," and, together with the  
13 Series 2017A Bonds and the Series  
14 2017B Bonds the "Series 2017  
15 Bonds.")

16 1. The proceeds of the Series  
17 2017A Bonds will be used by the  
18 School to finance and refinance the  
19 costs of the following:

20 (A) acquisition, construction,  
21 equipping and furnishing of an  
22 approximately 112,500 square foot  
23 building (five-story plus a  
24 basement), including, but not  
25 limited to, approximately 77,215

1  
2 square feet for use as high school  
3 classrooms, administrative areas,  
4 auditorium, gymnasium and cafeteria  
5 and the remaining approximately  
6 35,000 square feet will be used as a  
7 new garage and parking area located  
8 in the lower level (the "2017  
9 Improvements"), all located on an  
10 approximately 1.7 acres of land (the  
11 "2017 Land"), which Land is located  
12 at 117 North Franklin Street in the  
13 Village of Hempstead, Nassau County,  
14 New York (collectively, the  
15 Improvements and the Land, the "2017  
16 Facility");

17 (B) paying capitalized interest  
18 on the Series 2017A Bonds during the  
19 construction period;

20 (C) funding a debt service  
21 reserve, if required, for the Series  
22 2017A Bonds; and.

23 (D) paying certain costs of  
24 issuance of the Series 2017A Bonds  
25 (collectively, paragraphs (A), (B)

1  
2 and (C) of the section shall be  
3 referred to as the "2017 Project").

4 2. The proceeds of 2017B Bonds  
5 will be used by the Issuer to  
6 finance and refinance the costs of  
7 the following:

8 (A) the refunding of all or  
9 certain maturities of the Issuer's  
10 \$10,505,000 Tax-Exempt Education  
11 Revenue Bonds, Series 2011A (the  
12 Academy Charter School Project), of  
13 which approximately \$10,130,000 is  
14 currently outstanding (the "Series  
15 2011 Bonds"), and the proceeds o  
16 which were used for: (i) the  
17 acquisition of an existing  
18 approximately 1.73 acre parcel of  
19 land at 117 North Franklin Street,  
20 Hempstead, New York (further  
21 identified as Section 34, Block 291,  
22 Lot 88) (the "2011 Land"), (ii) the  
23 construction, renovation and  
24 equipping of an approximately 34,540  
25 square foot two-story building

1  
2 located thereon, including, but not  
3 limited to, selective demolition of  
4 the existing interior, installation  
5 of new interior walls and acoustic  
6 ceilings with wall and floor  
7 finishes, new lighting,  
8 modifications to the electrical  
9 distribution, HVAC systems,  
10 sprinkler, plumbing and fire alarm  
11 systems, as well as facade  
12 alterations and roof upgrading, all  
13 to create space for administrative  
14 offices, classrooms, and work areas  
15 for the purpose of providing  
16 educational opportunities to  
17 children in the Town of Hempstead  
18 and surrounding areas (collectively,  
19 the "2011 Improvements" and "2011  
20 Equipment"; and, together with the  
21 Land, the "2011 Facility"), (iii)  
22 paying capitalized interest on the  
23 Series 2011 Bonds during the  
24 construction period; (iv) funding a  
25 debt service reserve, if required

1  
2 for the Series 2011 Bonds, and (v)  
3 paying certain costs of issuance of  
4 the Series 2011 Bonds and certain  
5 working capital costs incurred by  
6 the School in connection with the  
7 Series 2011 Bonds and the 2011  
8 Facility (collectively, the "2011  
9 Project");

10 (B) the refunding of all or  
11 certain maturities of the Issuer's  
12 \$12,970,000 Tax-Exempt Education  
13 Revenue Bonds, Series 2013A (the  
14 Academy Charter School Project), of  
15 which approximately \$12,970,000 is  
16 currently outstanding (the "Series  
17 2013A Bonds") and \$545,000 Taxable  
18 Education Revenue Bonds, Series  
19 2013B (the Academy Charter School  
20 Project), of which approximately  
21 \$255,000 is currently outstanding  
22 (the "Series 2013B Bonds, and  
23 together with the Series 2013A  
24 Bonds, the "Series 2013 Bonds"), and  
25 the proceeds of which were used for;



1  
2 (i) the acquisition of an existing  
3 approximately 1.3 acre parcel of  
4 land at 159 North Franklin Street,  
5 Village of Hempstead, Town of  
6 Hempstead, New York (further  
7 identified as Section 34, Block 291,  
8 Lot 86) (the "2013 Land"), (ii) the  
9 expansion of an existing  
10 approximately 39,004 square foot  
11 four-story building components  
12 including the construction,  
13 renovation and selective demolition  
14 to non-structural building  
15 components including, but not  
16 limited to, walls, ceilings,  
17 miscellaneous piping, duct work,  
18 removal and replacement of the HVAC  
19 systems, metal framing and drywall  
20 work to create elevator lobby areas,  
21 corridors and classroom at each  
22 floor level, facade modifications to  
23 existing east elevation of existing  
24 building, upgrading and alteration  
25 of the plumbing, sprinkler and fire

1  
2 alarm systems, modifications of the  
3 2nd - 4th floor ceiling assemblies  
4 into a one hour fire rated assembly,  
5 reinforcing of existing floor slabs  
6 on floors 2-4 to increase structural  
7 capacity in the new corridor and  
8 lobby areas, and removal of all  
9 interior walls and construction of  
10 new classrooms and associated  
11 offices and support areas  
12 (collectively, the "2013  
13 Improvements"), (iii) the  
14 construction and equipping of a new  
15 approximately 17,000 square foot  
16 building on the Land to include an  
17 approximately 8,000 square foot full  
18 basement area with locker rooms,  
19 cafeteria, warming kitchen and  
20 associated storage uses  
21 (collectively, the "Gymnasium  
22 Building"; and, together with the  
23 2013 Land and the 2013 School  
24 Improvements, (the "2013 Facility",  
25 and together with the 2011 Facility

1  
2 and the 2017 Facility, the  
3 "Facility") (the resulting square  
4 footage of the 2013 Improvements  
5 together with the Gymnasium Building  
6 total approximately 68,000 square  
7 feet), all for the purpose of  
8 providing educational opportunities  
9 to middle school children in the  
10 Town of Hempstead and surrounding  
11 areas, (iv) paying capitalized  
12 interest on the Series 2013 Bonds  
13 during the construction period; (v)  
14 funding a debt service reserve, if  
15 required, for the Series 2013 Bonds,  
16 and (vi) paying certain Costs of  
17 issuance of the Series 2013 Bonds.

18 (C) funding a debt service  
19 reserve, if required, for the Series  
20 2017B Bonds; and.

21 (D) paying certain costs of  
22 issuance of the Series 2017B Bonds  
23 (collectively, paragraphs (A), (B),  
24 and (C) of this section shall be  
25 referred to as th "Prior Projects",

1  
2 and collectively with the 2017  
3 Project, the "Project").

4 The 2017C Bonds will be used to  
5 finance and refinance certain  
6 portions of the Project that are not  
7 eligible for financing that is  
8 exempt from federal income taxation  
9 pursuant to the Code.

10 The Facility will be owned,  
11 operated and/or managed by the  
12 School.

13 The proceeds of the Series 2017  
14 Bonds will be loaned by the Issuer  
15 to the School pursuant to the terms  
16 of a Loan Agreement between the  
17 Issuer and the School to pay the  
18 cost of the Project. The Series  
19 2017 Bonds will be a special  
20 obligation of the Issuer payable  
21 solely from loan payments made by  
22 the School to the Issuer pursuant to  
23 the Loan Agreement and certain other  
24 assets of the School pledged to the  
25 repayment of the Series 2017 Bonds.

1  
2 The Series 2017 Bonds shall not be a  
3 debt of the State of New York or any  
4 political subdivision thereof,  
5 including the Town of Hempstead, and  
6 neither the State of New York nor  
7 any political subdivision thereof,  
8 including the Town of Hempstead,  
9 shall be liable thereon.

10 A representative of the Issuer  
11 will, at the above-stated time and  
12 place, hear and accept written  
13 comments from all persons with views  
14 in favor of or opposed to either the  
15 issuance of the Series 2017 Bonds,  
16 the granting of other financial  
17 assistance contemplated by the  
18 Issuer of the location or nature of  
19 the Project. At the hearing, all  
20 persons will have the opportunity to  
21 review the application for financial  
22 assistance filed by the School with  
23 the Issuer, and an analysis of the  
24 costs and benefits of the proposed  
25 Project.

1  
2 Minutes of the hearing will be  
3 made available to Honorable Anthony  
4 J. Santino, Supervisor of the Town  
5 of Hempstead. Approval of the  
6 issuance of the Series 2017A Bonds  
7 and the 2017B Bonds by the Town of  
8 Hempstead, through Honorable Anthony  
9 J. Santino, is necessary in order  
10 for the interest on the Series 2017A  
11 Bonds and the 2017B Bonds to be  
12 excluded from gross income for  
13 federal income tax purposes.

19 Anyone that would like to be  
20 heard, we would like to hear from  
21 you. Please step forward and  
22 identify yourself.

23 MR. HAUGHTON: Good morning  
24 Board. My name is Wayne Haughton.  
25 I'm the Executive Director for the

1  
2 Academy Charter School and what you  
3 see here is a typical presentation  
4 of what the school is doing in  
5 Hempstead. These boys and girls  
6 they are all exuberant and they're  
7 happy and they want to know that the  
8 future of their school is safe.

9 Currently we are asking for  
10 permission to build a high school  
11 and this is the future of everything  
12 you see present in this room, and we  
13 just want to assure you that we have  
14 made a difference in Hempstead and  
15 we have made a difference in the  
16 lives of all these young people you  
17 see present here, and we are so  
18 conscious of the fact that their  
19 future is paramount to anything that  
20 we do in Hempstead.

21 So we beseech you and we would  
22 be very welcoming if you consider  
23 our project in a positive way  
24 because it's not just what we are  
25 doing today, but what we're doing

1  
2 tomorrow and years to come because  
3 of the lives of these young people  
4 are important to us.

5 Thank you for considering us  
6 and thank you for being of great  
7 assistance to us in helping to  
8 accomplish what we are doing here in  
9 the Village of Hempstead. Thank  
10 you.

11 MR. PAROLA: Thank you, Mr.  
12 Haughton.

13 Just for the record, in case it  
14 is not expressed elsewhere, I want  
15 it here that because this project is  
16 going upward and not expanding  
17 horizontally there is no reduction  
18 in taxes from the Village of  
19 Hempstead, which this Board and  
20 staff, of which I'm a member, well  
21 recognizes the impact on this  
22 community and we're very cognisant  
23 of that. In every project that we  
24 do in the Village, we're concerned  
25 with the homeowners and the tax base



1  
2 and the ability of the Village and  
3 the regular schools, as well as the  
4 fine job you do to provide the  
5 benefits that are so necessary for  
6 your future. So with that I will  
7 take our next witness.

8 MS. O'NEIL: Good morning  
9 everyone. Good morning Board. My  
10 name is Sandra O'Neil. I'm the  
11 current president of the Charter  
12 School Teacher Organization. I have  
13 had a child in the charter school  
14 since it began in 2009 and my  
15 daughter is actually in eighth grade  
16 and is graduating on Wednesday.

17 I also have a son in the  
18 Charter School here, the architect,  
19 and he is moving up on Tuesday,  
20 tomorrow. So, as you can see, I  
21 believe in the mission and the  
22 vision of the Academy Charter  
23 School. The school has given my  
24 children better education. They  
25 believe in fostering education

1  
2 success in our students here. The  
3 mission of the Academy Charter  
4 School is one that I totally believe  
5 in, as well as other members of the  
6 parental staff here today, a few of  
7 the parents that took the time off  
8 from work to come today to show  
9 their support for the school and to  
10 see its success.

11 As I said before, they provide  
12 my children with first-class  
13 education and I want to see that  
14 that education opportunity continues  
15 to grow. They have had the students  
16 focused on academic success. The  
17 elementary schools are all named  
18 after a college or university. My  
19 daughter, when she came in the first  
20 grade, her school was named after  
21 Boston University and to this day  
22 it's been so engrained in her to  
23 strive for success and educational  
24 excellence that she still wants to  
25 go to Boston University now in the

1  
2 eighth grade, so that's something  
3 that the school has instilled in  
4 them from kindergarten. They also  
5 have Harvard and Yale and they  
6 identify with that.

7 The school's motto is to learn,  
8 lead and serve. And so in the  
9 elementary, as I said before, they  
10 are named after colleges and  
11 universities. In the middle school  
12 they are named after powerful  
13 leaders in the community and in the  
14 high school they're named after  
15 service institutions, so that  
16 service mentality is engraved in  
17 them from the beginning.

18 The kids you see before you  
19 today are kids that are going to  
20 remember their community, are going  
21 to come back to their community,  
22 serve their community and help their  
23 community strive and be successful.

24 The academy has made it a  
25 priority to build character in these

1  
2 students so every month they put in  
3 a little bit of character  
4 development because we're training  
5 young minds to become better members  
6 of society.

7 I implore you, urge you, for  
8 our application so we continue to  
9 grow as we invest in our students  
10 and as you also invest in our  
11 students. Thank you very much.

12 MR PAROLA: Thank you.

13 KIMANI PANTHIER: Good morning  
14 and thank you for the opportunity to  
15 address the Board. My name is  
16 Kimani Panthier. I am here today  
17 representing the students who have  
18 been lucky to even graduate from the  
19 Academy Charter School, those that  
20 are still attending classes and the  
21 many students who will enroll in the  
22 future.

23 It is important for this Board  
24 to appreciate your role today. To  
25 put it simply, you will be helping

1  
2 to transform lives.

3 In several short years the  
4 Academy has proven that when  
5 students are given a chance to learn  
6 they can achieve anything. When  
7 kids love going to classes, they can  
8 achieve anything. When parents and  
9 teachers work together on behalf of  
10 those kids, together we can achieve  
11 anything. And these aren't just  
12 mere words.

13 As a graduate of the Academy,  
14 this is about my education, my life  
15 and my future. I wanted to be here  
16 today because you may see a photo of  
17 what the Academy High School will  
18 look like but the rest of us see  
19 something much more than that. That  
20 is our launch pad to the future on  
21 behalf of all students who will go  
22 here for many years to come. Thank  
23 you.

24 MR. PAROLA: Thank you.

25 MS. GILROY: Good morning.

MR. PAROLA: Good morning.

MS. GILROY: My name is  
Antoinette Gilroy. I'm one of the  
parents. My daughter is now in  
ninth grade. She started at the  
Academy Charter School in the fifth  
grade and this school has  
successfully made her enjoy school.  
She is highly motivated. Probably,  
to my discredit, I have not had to  
check homework in years because  
she's so highly motivated. Her  
third marking period in high school  
she achieved a 4.0071 GPA and she  
loves school.

What I am very impressed about  
here as a parent is that the  
teachers, the administrators,  
everyone who helps keep the building  
clean, the security, they have  
provided an environment for my child  
that is extremely safe regardless of  
where it is located. They have  
successfully kept the children

1 almost in a bubble I like to say.  
2 The outside world, they come from  
3 there home and then they go back but  
4 while they are in school they are  
5 safe. And my child, I can speak for  
6 myself saying, she is happy and  
7 she's excited about learning and  
8 about her future. In that school  
9 she's had mentors, teachers who make  
10 themselves available, not just  
11 during the academic part of school.  
12 They have a very, very vibrant after  
13 school program that helps to guide  
14 the kids, provide structure in terms  
15 of what would I like to do in my  
16 college years, what would I like to  
17 contribute to my community, what  
18 role could I play. So in my  
19 experience, the teachers here are  
20 all number one. The administrators  
21 in the school are all number one. I  
22 love them. I pray for them because  
23 I'm so excited about what is going  
24 on.  
25

1  
2 She is now in the ninth grade  
3 and hopefully she will graduate from  
4 the 12th grade and go to college  
5 from this school. Like I tell my  
6 friends, if it's not broken, there  
7 is no need to fix it, and this  
8 school is doing wonders.

9 So thank you so much for  
10 allowing us to speak. I had to  
11 speak ad lib. I had no idea that I  
12 would address you, but it's my  
13 privilege and thanks for listening.

14 MR. PAROLA: Thank you very  
15 much.

16 MS. HARRISON: Good morning.  
17 May name is Claudette Harrison.  
18 I've been a resident of the Village  
19 of Hempstead for 39 years and I've  
20 seen things change over the years.  
21 I'm also a grandmother that has  
22 children in the Academy.

23 I'm so proud of what they're  
24 doing. Their accomplishments. My  
25 granddaughter, the 5-year old, comes



1  
2 over and says, "Nana, I can read."  
3 And it's such a joy and I've watched  
4 how the Academy has progressed from  
5 elementary to this level and I feel  
6 that why change something and take  
7 it away. It's improved greatly.

8 The high school is necessary  
9 because parents are getting choices.  
10 Those that can't afford private  
11 school because our regular schools  
12 is not doing as well as they should,  
13 we should give the parents a chance  
14 and an opportunity to let their kids  
15 progress up to college because the  
16 Academy is offering a lot more to  
17 them than the local public school  
18 is.

19 I'm so proud. We need to let  
20 the high school be built. And as a  
21 taxpayer, I'm happy to spend my  
22 taxes on the charter school instead  
23 of the public school. Thank you.

24 MR. CORNACHIO: Good morning.  
25 I'm William Cornachio from Rivkin

1  
2 Radler. We represent the Academy  
3 Charter School in this activity. I  
4 was not planning to speak but Mr.  
5 Wayne Haughton requested me to speak  
6 and what lawyer do you know would  
7 resist the temptation?

8 MR. RYAN: I think some of the  
9 other people, particularly that  
10 young man, did a better job than  
11 you'll ever do.

12 MR. CORNACHIO: And I don't  
13 doubt it.

14 What I would like to point out  
15 that has not been pointed out so far  
16 is that Academy Charter School is  
17 the best performing school in this  
18 entire area. When we appeared  
19 before the IDA Board a couple of  
20 weeks ago, Wayne Haughton mentioned  
21 that the math scores of the grade  
22 level that escapes me right now were  
23 higher than that of the Garden City  
24 school. You should have seen the  
25 jaws drop on members of the Board.

1  
2           And looking at these joyful  
3 faces, I mean, this is the real joy.  
4 I hope it is as much for you as it  
5 is for me. And part of the joy for  
6 me is, as a professional, I have the  
7 opportunity to bring my skills to do  
8 good and it's one of the rare  
9 opportunities you have as a lawyer  
10 to do good, as a commercial real  
11 estate lawyer.

12           So I ask this Board to, like  
13 me, please take pleasure in doing  
14 good in approving this application.  
15 Thank you.

16           MR. PAROLA: Thanks.

17           MR. HENDRICK: We won't tell  
18 your boss that this young man did  
19 better than you.

20           MR. HALLOWAY: Good morning  
21 Members of the Board. My name is  
22 Travis Halloway. I currently serve  
23 here as the high school principal,  
24 currently to our wonderful ninth  
25 grade students.

1  
2 I just stand here to let you  
3 know -- to be a testament of the  
4 work that we're doing. I told my  
5 kids last week that I am just  
6 excited at the tremendous growth  
7 that we've made from the beginning.  
8 This is our first year as a high  
9 school. We all came into this new  
10 and we wanted to see something  
11 great.

12 I've been at the Academy for  
13 about five years now and to see the  
14 amount of growth that we've made  
15 over the years has been profound to  
16 me. One of the things that I've  
17 come to learn being at the Academy,  
18 among some of our successes, we are  
19 a well-performing charter school in  
20 Nassau County. And, in my opinion,  
21 and I told my kids this, I have the  
22 best kids I could have ever asked  
23 for. What we do here at the Academy  
24 is more than just raising scholars.  
25 We want them to be smart, but our

1  
2 mission is to create world-class  
3 competitive scholars that will learn  
4 today, lead tomorrow and serve in  
5 the future. I am proud to say that  
6 I'm a part of what we're doing here  
7 in the Village of Hempstead and in  
8 the Town of Hempstead, in the State  
9 of New York, in this country and in  
10 this world because our scholars are  
11 world-class competitive scholars  
12 that are learning today so they can  
13 lead tomorrow and serve in the  
14 future. Thank you so much for your  
15 consideration.

16 MR. PAROLA: Anyone else want  
17 to step forward and be heard? Any  
18 students want to be heard?

19 Just for the record, I point  
20 out that there is a wonderful sign  
21 that we're able to look at that says  
22 "We are building our lives at the  
23 Academy."

24 MR. STAPLETON: Good morning,  
25 my name is Nicholas Stapleton. I've

1  
2           been at the Academy at the initial  
3           founding in 2009 and now it's 2017,  
4           eight years, and I've been  
5           responsible for the overall academic  
6           program, and I'm here to tell you  
7           today that one will look at our  
8           geography with the performance at  
9           the State level and if you compare  
10          the Academy to other schools  
11          systems, Uniondale, and look at our  
12          performance, for example, in the  
13          Village of Hempstead School  
14          District, we're performing  
15          38 percent beyond what the students  
16          in Hempstead are at in language arts  
17          and 42 percent beyond in  
18          mathematics. Our students here, as  
19          I look at them, college-bound, so  
20          please give them the opportunity to  
21          continue to grow and continue to  
22          excel. Thank you so much.

23                   MR. PAROLA: Thank you. Is  
24                   there anyone else that wishes to be  
25                   heard?

1  
2           So the way this works is that  
3 this proposal, everything you've  
4 said here today, will be shared with  
5 the rest of our Board members. This  
6 proposal will be on our calendar  
7 this Thursday for adoption and your  
8 participation, your presence here  
9 today, makes that decision.

10           I think, as a staff member, I  
11 can say for my Board, much easier to  
12 move forward with than otherwise.  
13 So your presence here, I'm saying,  
14 is very important.

15           MR. HENDRICK: Juts for the  
16 benefit of all the students and  
17 whoever else, everything that was  
18 said here today has been taken down  
19 by the reporter here, so it's all  
20 going to be in a written record  
21 that's going to be reviewed. So  
22 your words are immortalized, as they  
23 say.
